The Indiana Lakes Management Society is seeking abstracts for presentations at the 20th Annual Indiana Lakes Management Society Annual Conference “Reflecting on 20 Years of Protecting Indiana’s Lakes.” The conference will be held **March 28th and 29th, 2008** at the Ramada Plaza in Warsaw, Indiana. The deadline to submit an abstract is **Friday, January 18, 2008**. If your abstract is accepted, you will be notified in writing no later than February 1, 2007.

We are looking for presentations targeting similarities and differences of Indiana’s natural lakes and man-made reservoirs. Presentations will be grouped to highlight similarities and differences in the various types of lakes present in Indiana. Presentations that cover topics on natural and/or man-made lakes are welcome and will be included in the program. Targeted topics include:

- Fisheries Management of Natural or Man-Made Lakes and Ponds
- Shoreline Stabilization
- Sanitation/Leach Fields and Sewer System Implementation
- Plant Management (Exotic or Native)
- Water Quality for Lakes, Ponds, and Reservoirs
- Watershed Impacts to Water Quality-Agricultural and Residential Community Impacts
- Boating Impacts to Ecological, Aesthetic, and Social Enjoyment of Lakes
- Lake Associations and Local Efforts to Actively Work in Your Lake or Watershed
- Dam/Water Control Structure Maintenance and Inspection
- History and Management of Lakes
- Grant Opportunities and Fund-Raising

If you are involved in water quality assessment, lake community development, best management practice implementation, community water body monitoring, simply enjoy working with your lake association and/or community, then consider sharing your experience and expertise at the 20th annual Indiana Lakes Management Society Conference.

We invite presentations that deal with all aspects of the management, protection, and restoration of lakes, reservoirs and watersheds. All formats (oral or poster) are welcome with oral presentations being accompanied by a PowerPoint presentation, if possible. Abstracts should contain the following information:

- **Title:** The title should accurately summarize the subject of the proposed presentation.
- **Author(s):** Provide names and an affiliation of all authors (mailing addresses, telephone, fax, e-mail). Underline the presenting author.
- **Text:** The single-spaced abstract should state the purpose, significant results, and main conclusions of your work. Abstracts must not exceed 250 words.
- **Format:** Poster, oral (30 minutes). Please indicate the format(s) desired.

Please note: Conference registration fees are not waived for contributing authors. Registration forms and conference materials will be sent to you upon acceptance of your abstract.
